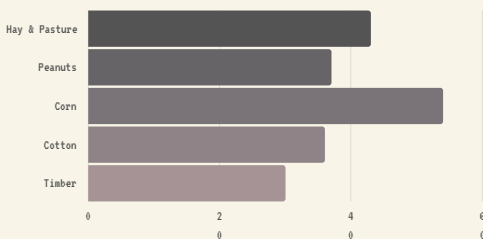

CROPS MOST FREQUENTLY DAMAGED BY FERAL SWINE

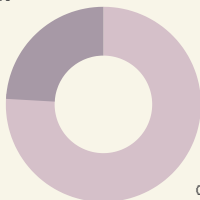


27% also reported damage to streams or ponds
